Due to the rapidly evolving situation, information is current as of the data collection dates



#### **Purpose**

This document focuses on the new Moderna and Pfizer Bivalent COVID-19 vaccine availability and inoculation schedule, revised booster dose criteria for 5- 11 years old and types of vaccines available. Health Canada announced the introduction of Moderna and Pfizer Bivalent COVID-19 vaccines on September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022, and October 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022, respectively. The information was collected from **September 09, 2022- October 25, 2022** 

#### **Audience**

• Public health actors, policymakers (all levels of government)

#### Methodology

• Most of the information is collected from publicly available sources, prioritizing resources such government websites but may also include media content from news articles. As information changes rapidly, the content is validated and augmented by public health experts, when available and as time allows.
